Examples of cheating:

- Describing the content of a test to someone who hasn't taken it
- Plagiarism- using someone else's words or ideas without proper credit
- Turning in someone else's work as your own
- Assisting someone with a test or quiz without the teacher's specific permission

Consequences of cheating:

- The assignment in question will receive a zero.
- The student may become ineligible for academic awards and honors including Honor Roll, National Honor Society, Valedictorian, etc.
- The student will receive discipline points or be suspended.
